

A Message from Bishop Malloy

JANUARY 2024

Dear Friends in Christ,

Your prayerful consideration of this year's 2024 National Appeal in the Diocese of Rockford is appreciated. Taking place January 13-14, this annual collection is an opportunity to support local and national efforts to share the Gospel. In the Diocese of Rockford, we combine the needs of the local and universal Church into three separate appeals held throughout the year. The National Appeal, in January, is the first of these in 2024. This appeal directly benefits the Catholic elementary schools throughout the diocese, which prepare our future families to keep the faith. Appeal funding also supports the retired priests' pension program for our 38 retired diocesan priests, many of whom still faithfully serve our parishes.

Also included in the National Appeal is the Retirement Fund for Religious. Donations directed toward this fund help provide medications, nursing assistance, and other necessities for the more than 25,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests living in the United States. The Benedictines of Marmion Abbey and the Congregation of the Resurrection both have had a presence in our own diocese and have benefited from this assistance.

Some funds from the National Appeal are used by The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. to support its students and to conduct research initiatives and training programs, such as the Master's program the university offers in Ecclesial Administration and Management, a separate credentialing program for campus ministers, and The Catholic Project – an initiative that brings together clergy and laity to address the challenges of the Church in the United States.

The Catholic Communication Campaign and the Catholic Campaign for Human Development also receive funding through our combined appeal effort. Locally, the communication campaign helps us share the Gospel through televised Catholic Masses and "Top O' the Morning" weekday broadcasts, periodic livestreamed Masses from the Cathedral of St. Peter, Be Reconciled Day, and other diocesan communications projects. Half of all collected funds for the Catholic Communication Campaign remain in our diocese. Local support is also received from donations to the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. Twenty-five percent of donations to CCHD stay in our diocese to support local anti-poverty projects.



Rising health-care costs and decreased income compound the struggle to provide adequate attention to these men and women who gave their lives to the faith and service. Using our contributions, religious congregations are implementing long-range retirement strategies, even as they continue to serve the people of God.
